

I'm not sure how I would use sound recorder in the classroom. I did investigate sound recorder and practiced with it. I have a microphone built into my monitor. The sound was clear, and it played back on Windows Media Player with no problem. When I tried to add narration to one of my Power Point Presentations, I went to Slide Show on the menu and added narration to a couple of slides the narration was very soft with lots of static. Is this sound recorder or a different sound program? The difference in the quality was great. Can I use sound recorder to make my narrations or do I need to use the narration program in PowerPoint. I'm a little confused about this. The video on making cds and copying cds was very useful. Currently we are using Roxio; it seems to work well and is easy to use.

I like the tool of using sound recorder in Start-Program-Accessories-Entertainment. It might be more convenient for me to use in the workplace. I often use Audacity to make MP3 files but in my work, i can't download and install it because the computer administrator block it. In addition, i use Window Media Player to burn CD in my own computer. After watching the software Veritas RecordNowDX, i tend to try downloading or having the administrator unblock the system a little bit. I love to know more software to have more choices.

You mention Windows XP and where to find Sound Recorder under All Programs. It's located in a similar place in Vista OS. I wonder if there are any differences in file location/capability between XP and Vista that might impact successful sound recording and CD burning. Thanks.
