The Interfaith Chaplain provides or coordinates delivery of a wide range of spiritual services to include: worship, education, counseling, direction, and support and crisis intervention to accommodate the diverse spiritual needs of the WCC population interested in participating in spiritual services. The Interfaith Chaplain's role is to be a non-judgmental caring influence in the lives of all individuals, a visible model of respect and caring for each person in spiritual need.

The Interfaith Chaplain provides spiritual and pastoral care to all inmates/residents and facilitates their opportunity to pursue their individual spiritual beliefs and practices in accordance with prescribed policies and protocols, current law, federal regulations, and the ALDF and ACA Standards.

#### **Qualifications:**

- Accredited as a Chaplain or previous Chaplaincy experience
- A complete and thorough knowledge of all recognized religions as well as their basic tenets and worship requirements
- Knowledge of basic security procedures in a detention setting and the skill to implement/maintain these procedures within the Interfaith program
- Working knowledge of existing ALDF Standards, relevant Policy and Procedure of the American Correctional Association, and other guidelines that govern Interfaith programming
