I use WhatsApp constantly with my (fully remote) Level 1 ESOL class. We have a class group that allows us to communicate and share both during and outside of class time. I use it to share screenshots of our class notes and Zoom annotations live throughout class. Students use it to submit pictures of their homework. Students also use it during class to share pictures of their writing. And, since I use the desktop version of WhatsApp, I am able to share my screen and process/ respond to everything they've sent during class. Being fully remote with beginners, I rely heavily on WhatsApp to be able to see what students are producing and gauge their understanding. And, because most students already use WhatsApp to communicate with their families abroad, the tech learning challenge is not too steep.

Clever: SSO (Single Sign-on)

How you implement it...

Our Instructional Technology Support Specialist runs a digital literacy boot camp during student orientation where students are trained/showed how to use the platform. Students are given an individualized clever badge: QR code that identifies their login information and they can scan to login to clever.

How it helps your practice and/or students...

All of the platforms we use are organized in Clever and once students login to Clever, they are automatically logged in to all those platforms such as: Ellii, Flocabulary, Pearson (Book), Aztec, Nearpod, Google Classroom, Zoom, Google Suite, etc.

Other platforms we have links for but not automatically signed in:
Leamos, Khan Academy, Northstar Digital Literacy

Clever SSO removes an extra barrier for students that are developing digital literacy skills, makes it easier for them to access materials without having to remember passwords for every platform. All ALC students are enrolled to Clever automatically through a sync between Laces and the LPS-IT department that I run daily.

How you implement it...

Each of my students has an ellii account which we use in 3 ways: for asynchronous work, in Zoom class for reading and listening activities that I present with a shared screen, and in Zoom class for activities the students can do and I can look at in real time. The Level 1 teacher in our program also uses the flashcard function in her class to present vocabulary.

How it helps your practice and/or students...

ellii.com has many different kinds of activities- matching, fill in the blank, speaking practice (record your voice), reading, listening, and videos. The students have learned to navigate the website to be able to do a variety of kinds of activities in many contexts. Some of the activities are self graded, so they can check their answers right away. Some I have to grade, so the students have to go back into the site to look for my comments. There is a lot of navigation to do as well as a lot of content.

Digital Literacy Tool: Blackboard

All students are trained in using Blackboard during orientation. Remote and hybrid students enter all Zoom meetings and access their work through Blackboard. Fully in-person classes are required to regularly do activities in Blackboard.

The Ultra version of Blackboard is user friendly and helps newcomers to technology become comfortable navigating a web page. Since all assignments are stored in Blackboard, students are able to keep up with their work even when they are unable to attend class.

How you implement it...

Both advisors and instructors use Screencastify to make videos for students. Screencastify records your screen and your voice. Advisors make Screencastify videos to show students how to access our classes, student email, and ed tech programs. Instructors use Screencastify videos for further instruction or async assignments.

How it helps your practice and/or students...

Screencastify allows us to deliver material to students with both auditory and visual instructions, increasing understanding. The videos become a resource that students can come back to for instructions or help at any time.

Student gmail accounts issued through Methuen Public Schools (MPS)

How you implement it...

On enrollment, each student is issued a gmail account through MPS. At orientation, students are provided a handout listing their login credentials and guided in accessing and using their gmail to connect to their class space (Google Classroom or Zoom) using either their own device or a ChromeBook borrowed from the program (90% of enrolled students borrow a device).

How it helps your practice and/or students...

Students routinely use Google tools (email, Classroom, Docs, Calendar, Meet, Slides, Forms, Jamboard, etc.) to communicate with teachers and advisors, create and share presentations, locate materials and submit assignments. They are more prepared to use such tools in the workplace and higher education.

Create calendars for specific event types and program staff availability. Send the specific link to students/volunteers/staff, and they can see times to make appointments. Some things we've used it for:

- Scheduling assessments/in-take calls
- Meeting with prospective volunteers
- Scheduling staff annual reviews
- Scheduling job interviews
- Coaching appointments

How it helps your practice and/or students...

It syncs to Zoom so it auto-creates a link, and it will send reminder emails so we don't have to. And we don't have to go back and forth on phone calls or emails to make appointments, which is a win for all.

How you implement it...

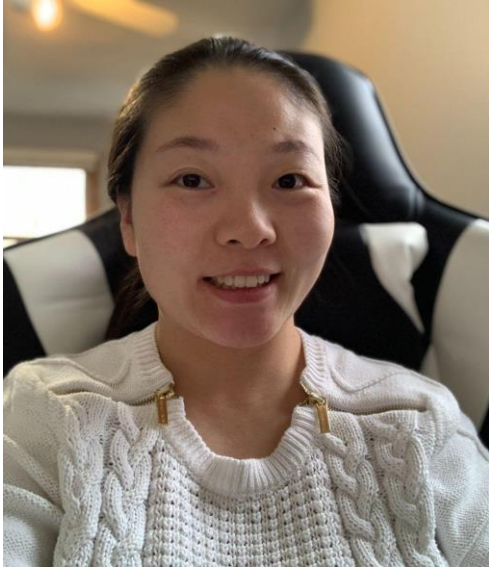
For tutors and/or students, we send them these guides to help them download, setup, join and host meetings on Zoom.
